


**Autumn Term No 7**

**Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> November 2025**

We have been having a wonderful time in the classroom, with the children fully engaged in their learning. Here is an overview of what the children have been working on.

**Nursery**




The children in Nursery have had a fantastic few weeks. They contributed to our whole school poppy display in the hall for Remembrance Day by making their own clay poppies. They also celebrated Bonfire Night by creating firework pictures and drawings.

We have been busy making a turtle using recycled materials brought in from home. The children have loved sticking and collaging the materials onto the turtle and watching him come to life.

Our new topic this term is *Journey into Space*. The children have really enjoyed reading *How to Catch a Star* by Oliver Jeffers and *Meet the Planets* by Carly Hart. They have explored the planet where they live, learned about space, and acted out piloting a rocket ship in our role-play corner. They have created some incredible rockets and even made delicious treats in our Alien Café outdoor kitchen. Well done, Nursery!

**Reception**

What a busy but exciting end to our last half term—and an equally wonderful start to the new one—we have had in Reception! We finished the half term by celebrating Diwali, learning about the festival of light and creating our very own diva lamps. When we returned to school, we explored Bonfire Night, talked about how to keep safe, and took part in lots of firework-themed activities. We also joined the whole of the Infant Academy to create a beautiful display of clay poppies and thoughtful homework projects for Remembrance Day.



As our new learning began, we enjoyed diving into our Literacy story *Whatever Next!* by Jill Murphy. We have been working hard on hearing sounds beyond the initial sound and beginning to spell CVC words. In Maths, we explored finding one more and one less than numbers to 5.


In Understanding the World, we have been investigating planet Earth and its features, as well as exploring the features of our immediate environment. This week, we are excited to build on this learning as we find out how we can look after our planet and local environment for World Geography Week!

**Year 1**

We have had another full and fun-filled week in Year One. Last week in English, the children took part in hot seating activities to explore the rabbit's actions in our class story *I Want My Hat Back* by Jon Klassen. They also enjoyed drama and role-play as they imagined what the characters might say in their own innovated versions, which they will be writing this week.


In Maths, the children worked systematically to find different pairs of numbers that make 7 and 8. They have also been busy learning new songs for our Year 1 Winter Performance and have brought their lines home to practise.

This week, we are looking forward to celebrating National Geography Awareness Week. Using our junk modelling materials, the children will create a display of sea creatures to help raise awareness of how our actions can affect the planet.



**Year 2**

This half term, Year 2 have been developing their understanding of informal written methods for addition and subtraction, particularly through partitioning two-digit numbers into tens and ones, and have now begun exploring multiples of 2, 5 and 10. In English, the children have written character descriptions of Goldilocks and created WANTED posters using ambitious verbs, while also comparing the traditional *Goldilocks and the Three Bears* with Anthony Browne's modern version, *You and Me*. Their Grammar lessons have focused on recognising sentence functions, identifying word classes and adding suffixes to root words. In Design and Technology, the children have started designing their own tote bags. In Science, they have been learning about the stages of human growth and ageing, and in RE they have explored how different religions celebrate special events.



## Remembrance Display

It has been wonderful to see the whole school come together to contribute to our Remembrance display. The range of thoughtful and creative pieces has truly made it something special. We would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to all our families who took the time to create and send in contributions for this meaningful whole-school project.

## Important Reminder – PE Pumps
